SOMETHING TO PONDER - A Catholic charity has sent 15 statues of the Virgin Mary to the Middle East to replace ones destroyed by ISIS. The group Œuvre d'Orient, a French association dedicated to helping persecuted Christians, has sent the statues from Lourdes to Ankawa, a suburb of the city of Erbil in Iraqi Kurdistan, which has a majority Catholic population. Once they arrive, they will be carried in procession through the town by Chaldean and Syriac Catholics, before being blessed and sent to their parishes. Œuvre d'Orient say the processions will be a testament to Jeremiah 31:17: "And here is hope for thy last end, saith the Lord: and the children shall return to their own borders

PROTESTANTS PROTEST - The Protestant Orange Order of Northern has asked its members to stop using the term 'RIP' to express grief or sympathy after a death. It said the phrase is unbiblical, un-Protestant, and a form of superstition connected to Catholicism. RIP is an abbreviation of 'rest in peace' or in Latin, 'requiescat in pace'. In a publication marking the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, the order called on Protestants to stop using the phrase. Wallace Thompson, secretary of Evangelical Protestants Northern Ireland, wrote a Facebook post on which the article was based. He told the BBC's Talkback program "Observing social media, we have noticed that the letters RIP are used a lot by Protestants, and by some evangelical Protestants." Mr. Thompson explained that for him, 'RIP' is a prayer and he did not encourage prayers for the dead. "From a Protestant point of view, we believe, when death comes, a person either goes to be with Christ for all eternity, or into hell. The Orange Order is the largest Protestant organization in Northern Ireland with at least 75,000 members, some of them in the Republic of Ireland. Its origins are found in a 1795 clash between Protestants and Catholics at the Battle of the Diamond near

Loughgall, County Armagh. In the battle's aftermath some of those involved swore a new oath to uphold the Protestant faith and be loyal to the King and his heirs, giving birth to the Orange Order. Since then, the order's principles and aims, and those of similar organizations it is related to, have changed little. While often provoking confrontation with Catholics, the Orange Order seeks to uphold the rule and ascendancy of a Protestant monarch in the United Kingdom. While the Orange Order may find the phrase offensive, in all reality the verse RIP has been found inscribed in Hebrew on gravestones dating from the 1st century BC, in the graveyard of Bet Shearim. It speaks of the righteous person who died because he could not stand the evil surrounding him. A recapture of these words, read as "come and rest in peace," has been transferred to the ancient Talmudic prayers, in a mixture of Hebrew and Aramaic of the 3rd century AD. It is used to this day in traditional Jewish ceremonies. The phrase was not found on tombstones before the eighth century. It became ubiquitous on the tombs of Catholics in particular as a prayerful request that the souls of the departed should find peace in the afterlife.

GOOD NEWS FROM OUR ORTHODOX COUSINS - Russia's Orthodox Church has reported a sharp rise in seminary admissions, with the highest numbers ever recorded now training for the priesthood in its 261 eparchies, or dioceses. The Interfax news agency said 1,593 ordinands were expected to begin studies this summer, a 19 percent increase from 2016, while a further 827 young men would also join the church's preparatory course, or propaedeuticum, a quarter more than last year - it added that a total of 5,877 seminarians were now preparing for ordination. The Russian church was savagely persecuted under Soviet rule in 1917-1991, but is now by far the largest of the world's 14 Orthodox churches, claiming 144 million members, with 368 bishops and around 40,000 priests and deacons. The church, which has 926 functioning monasteries and convents, is estimated to have opened three places of worship daily over the past three decades, bringing the total to 36,000 compared to just 6000 at the end of communist rule.
