**FATHER'S DAY THOUGHTS** – What does it take to be a good father? Here are some random thoughts. Fatherhood flows from a man's married vocation to be present to his wife. The problems caused by a father's absence from the family can cause children great suffering on many levels. There are different types of absence, from leaving the mother and child, to long hours away at work, or checking out of family life to hang out in the "man cave" all weekend. It could be a lack of warm emotional involvement. In any case, kids learn what is important in life from what their fathers do. If their fathers do

not spend time with them, they learn that they are not important. Recent research measures the deep impact a dad's presence has. By marrying the mothers of their children, for example, fathers in America reduce their children's risk of poverty by 82%. They dramatically reduce suicide, depression and anxiety, accidents and illness, behaviour problems and delinquency, academic problems, sexual activity, and drug use. Kids with involved dads exhibit more self-regulated behaviour, are happier, healthier and more successful in life. Studies show that Dad's religious commitment affects children much more than Mom's. Dad's example of going to Mass regularly profoundly impacts the likelihood that his sons and daughters will keep going to Mass as adults. Pope Francis offers these words: "The church ... is committed to supporting with all her strength the good and generous presence of fathers in families, for they are the irreplaceable guardians and mediators of faith in goodness, of faith in justice and in God's protection, like St. Joseph." May every father help their children know the goodness of our Father in heaven!

**MASSES IN HISTORIC BEDFORD CHURCH** – St. Thomas Church in Bedford is one of the most historic parishes in our region. While the current church is historic and beautiful most people are unaware that the parish maintains its original church, sometimes called the "Little Church" on East Street next to their old cemetery (between John Street and E. Vondersmith Avenue). Built in 1817 the tiny church is the oldest used church building in the diocese. It was restored in 1958 as a shrine. As they do in the summer the parish will hold Masses in the Little Church on Wednesday mornings at 8:00 AM. If you wish to see this simple, but historic church, consider dropping by for daily Mass on a Wednesday morning.

**NEW YORK CITY** – While the salsa produced in New York City is apparently awful, the "Big Apple" is home to many magnificent and historic Catholic churches. With that in mind Fr. Aron will be sponsoring a day trip/bus tour of historic Catholic churches in New York City on Sunday July 24<sup>th</sup>. The trip will include Latin High Mass at Holy Innocents Church, tours of St. Vincent Ferrer Church, and St. Peter Church. Additionally the trip will include an organ recital by Fr. Aron's good friend Professor Nicholas Will in the newly restored St. Patrick's Cathedral. The cost of the trip is \$80.00 per person and includes motor coach transportation and a hearty lunch at Tony DiNapoli's near Times Square. Pick up

***SOME THOUGHTS ON THE MASSACRE IN ORLANDO*** – The events that transpired this past weekend have left all of us wonder how a person could come to believe that homosexual people deserved to die and that he had the right to kill them; indeed, the violence that took place leaves sensible people with feelings of revulsion and disgust. Our prayers are with the victims, their families, and all those affected by this violence. Some years ago the American bishops offered the following thoughts that are worthy of consideration at this time. – *“The human person, made in the image and likeness of God, can hardly be adequately described by a reductionist reference to his or her sexual orientation. Every one living on the face of the earth has personal problems and difficulties, but challenges to growth, strengths, talents and gifts as well. Today, the Church provides a badly needed context for the care of the human person when she refuses to consider the person as a “heterosexual” or a “homosexual” and insists that every person has a fundamental Identity: the creature of God, and by grace, his child and heir to eternal life.”*

Aron has been asked to cover Mass at Somerset Prison that afternoon due to the priest who covers the prison is away and no other priest in the area has security clearances for SCI-Somerset.
