**CLASS ON LENTEN AND EASTER CUSTOMS OF EASTERN EUROPE –** Larry Kozlowski will return to Central City on Tuesday March 26<sup>th</sup> and April 2<sup>nd</sup> for two-part class on Lenten and Easter customs of Eastern Europe. The classes are free and open to everyone, all that is asked is that participants sign up and promise to attend both sessions. To register please phone the rectory by March 20<sup>th</sup>.

**BUS TRIP** - On Sunday May 19<sup>th</sup> our parish will be sponsoring a bus trip to visit historic churches and eat delicious food in the city of Cleveland. While the trip had originally been planned for Pittsburgh there was an unexpected scheduling change at one of the parishes and the decision was made to visit Cleveland instead. Departing via Bollman motor coach (5:00 AM) the day in Cleveland will begin with Latin High Mass at St. Stephen's Church, an old German ethnic parish, on Cleveland's West Side. Following Mass, we will head to the historic West Side Market. Home to meat, spice, and produce vendors, the market also has a variety of lunch counters available for lunch (on your own). Following lunch, the group will visit the Irish St. Colman Parish, followed by the Polish St. Stanislaus Parish, an incredible church built in the "Polish Cathedral" style. Our last stop before dinner will be at St. Vitus Church, the largest Slovenian ethnic parish in the United States. Dinner will be at Guarino's Restaurant, Cleveland's oldest Italian restaurant. Dinner includes locally baked bread, house salad with Guarino's homemade Italian dressing, nonalcoholic beverage, and a choice of chicken parmesan, spaghetti with meatballs, eggplant roll ups, or homemade lasagna (cash bar available). We should arrive back in Central City at 10:30 PM. The trip is open to anyone – first come, first served. The cost is \$80.00 per person and includes dinner. **IF YOU LIKE FILET-O-FISH, THANK CATHOLICS** – Nearly one quarter of McDonald's Filet-of-Fish sandwich sales take place during Lent, when many fast-food customers are abstaining from meat. That's exactly what the McDonald's operator who first put the cheese-topped sandwich on his menu had in mind back in 1962. According to an account in *Reader's Digest*, when Cincinnati McDonald's franchise owner Lou Groen noticed that his heavily Catholic clientele was avoiding his restaurant on Fridays, he suggested to McDonald's owner Ray Kroc that they add introduce a fish sandwich. Kroc thought fried fish wouldn't fly, but suggested offering customers the choice of a meat-free "Hula Burger" made of pineapple and cheese on a bun and Groen's Filet-o-Fish. Whichever sandwich was more popular would earn a spot on the menu. Needless to say, the fish sandwich won, and Groen's restaurant thrived. Since then, the sandwich has been McDonald's fixture, all year long.
