HOLYDAY OF OBLIGATION THIS WEEK - August 15th is the great feast of the Assumption of Mary into heaven, a holy day of obligation for Catholics. Our parish Masses will be at NOON at Sacred Heart and 7:00 PM at St. John. Lest there be any confusion, the feast is not about us guessing (or "assuming") that Mary is in heaven; rather, the feast celebrates the dogma of the Catholic faith that Mary, at the end of her earthly life, was taken up body and soul into heaven, where she lives to this day. This is different than what happens to most Christians, whose bodies remain on earth while their souls go to heaven. But why is this called an "assumption"? Our Lord Jesus also went to heaven, body and soul, at the end of his time on earth, but we refer to it as his "ascension." The difference has to do with who Mary and Jesus are and how they got to heaven. Jesus Christ is the Son of God made man, with both divine and human natures. When he went to heaven, body and soul, at the end of his earthly life, he did so on his own power. Jesus himself was the active agent. Thus, he ascended (active) into heaven. Mary, on the other hand, is of course merely a creature, dependent entirely on the gratuitous grace of God for anything. She could not and did not go to heaven on her own power, but instead was taken there. Thus, she was assumed (passive) into heaven. Catholic theology is generally very careful with its words. Often, as in this case, a seemingly small difference in terminology can be a sign of important distinctions.

FR. ARON'S NEW TRIP TO EUROPE - After a lot of planning, Fr. Aron is proud to announce his next tour of Europe, OPEN TO ANYONE who loves beautiful churches, epic meals, unforgettable scenery, and fascinating history. The trip is entitled "Oberammergau Passion Play and Enchanting Eastern Europe with Father Aron" and is scheduled from September 16 through 24, 2020. The famous Oberammergau Passion Play is included as well as sites and restaurants handpicked by Fr. Aron based on his many European ventures. If you have want to see Europe for the first time, are a seasoned traveler who wants to explore ever enchanting Eastern Europe, or simply visit some of the places Father visited on his adventures, consider this trip. The trip, run through Best Catholic Pilgrimages, includes daily Mass and airfare. The total cost is \$3,399 (for those who wish to arrange their own airfare the trip Land Only portion of the trip is \$1,802). For more information, or for a brochure, please call the rectory or see Fr. Aron. Below is the basic itinerary...

Day 2: 9/17 - Munich. Arrival in Munich - Upon arrival, proceed to the arrival's hall, where you will be greeted by your tour guide. Transfer to your hotel for check-in. Time permitting, an orientation walk in the city including Marienplatz and its Town Hall, the Olympic City and the historic center. Mass at a historic local church and dinner at Hoffbrau House (cost not included) restaurant. Overnight in Munich.

Day 1: 9/16/2020 - Depart the United States for Munich, Germany.

Day 3: 09/18 - Munich - Oberammergau Breakfast at the hotel and check-out Depart to Oberammergau, a woodcarving center of Germany and home of the famous Passion Play. The history of the Passion Play at Oberammergau goes back to the year 1634, when the quaint alpine village of Oberammergau was threatened by the deadly and contagious disease known as the Black Plague that scourged Europe, killing two-thirds of the population of Germany. The people of Oberammergau vowed that if the village would be spared, a reenactment of the life and suffering of Christ would be performed FOREVER. The village was miraculously saved from the ravages of the Black Death. Since that date, the play has been performed every ten years, the next time it will be held will be in 2030. Upon arrival check into the hotel. Lunch on your own 1:30 - 1st part of the Passion Play 4:00 - break 3-course dinner during the break 7:00 - 9:30 - 2nd part of the Passion Play Overnight in Oberammergau or vicinity.

Day 4: 09/19 - Oberammergau - Fraueninsel - Cesky Krumlov, Czech Republic. Travel from Oberammergau to the Chiemsee: the largest Bavarian lake. Reach by the public ferry Frauenchiemsee, where you can have a quick walk around the idyllic island with an old female Benedictine monastery (still in operation, founded in AD 782) and a beautiful garden café. Take the ferry back to the main land and travel by bus towards Cesky Krumlov, in Czech Republic. Check in at the hotel and overnight.

Day 5: 09/20 - Cesky Krumlov/Prague Go to Mass early in Cesky Krumlov, try to hit an early tour of the Baroque Theater and then head to Prague, famous for its Gothic and Baroque architecture and ranked as one of the most beautifully preserved cities in Europe. Tour part of the main historical centre of Prague, passing by Wenceslas Square in the New Town, the Old Town by way Golden Town and then go the Lesser Town to see the Charles Bridge that is adorned with many Baroque statues. We will visit and celebrate Mass at the Church of Our Lady of Victory, where we will see the Infant Jesus of Prague. Tonight, dinner at the folklore show venue. Overnight in Prague.

Day 6: 09/21 Prague - Kutna Hora - Olomouc. Early tour of St. Vitus and the castle district, then on to Kutna Hora to visit the bone chapel, cathedral, and have lunch at Pivnice Dacicky in Kutna Hora, Fr. Aron's favorite eatery in the world (home of the sword of meat)! Depart for Olomuc, capital if the region of Moravia, to visit the highlights of the town such as the Main Square with the Trinity Column, the Astronomical Clock, the Town Council Palace and the Fountain of Cesar. Dinner at Moravaska, a typical Moravian restaurant. Overnight in Olomuc.

Day 7: 09/22 - Olomuc - Wielczka - Krakow. After breakfast we depart to the famous Wieliczka Salt Mines, Europe's oldest, longest and deepest Salt Mines, with stunning chapels and chambers cut out of salt including the Church of St Kinga! After our tour and Mass we continue to Krakow. On arrival enjoy a guided tour of the city, including Market Square, surrounded by historic churches, such as St. Mary Church that is considered as the second most important church in Krakow. The square is the largest medieval town square in Europe. We see Cloth Hall and Town Hall Tower Hall and visit the most important church, the Wawel Cathedral, considered as the official Polish Santuary. Dinner and folklore show in a local restaurant and overnight in Krakow

Day 8: 09/23 - Free Day in Krakow Today is a free day to enjoy on your own or join Fr. Aron on an optional excursion to Vlkolinec, Slovakia, with sightseeing, to enjoy the traditional wooden houses (like the homes your grandparents lived in before they left the old country) and the beautiful natural landscape that made Vlkolinec part of the UNESCO World Heritage. Father will celebrate Mass. Return to Krakow for overnight. For those not making the optional trip (\$96.00 additional charge), tours can be arranged on your own to visit Auschwitz, Częstochowa, the homes of your ancestors (if your family is from southern Poland or northern Slovakia), or enjoy a free day in Krakow.

Day 9: 09/24 - Depart to USA Breakfast at the hotel and transfer to the Krakow airport for the flight home.
