WELCOME FATHER TOMPKINS – Many thanks are extended to Fr. John-Mary Tompkins O.S.B., who will be covering the 10:30 AM Mass this weekend while Fr. Aron is in Boswell. Please offer Father a warm welcome this weekend.

HAPPY VETERANS DAY - The place, a church. The era, World War II. Two priests are seen celebrating Holy Mass, each offering the same sacrifice in the same Latin language, but at different altars. You will recall in those days, the Mass was in great part offered in silence, and it was not

uncommon to see a priest offering Holy Mass at the main altar of the church while another was offering his own Mass privately at the same time at a side altar. As the story goes, after completing their offering of the most Holy Sacrifice, both priests returned to the sacristy and were quietly divesting themselves of their vestments. To their great shock and amazement, when each priest removed his final vestment, he saw that one of them was wearing the uniform of a priest chaplain for the American forces, and the other the uniform of a priest chaplain to the German troops! In a moment of grace and with that infallible sign of God's presence which is the Church's universal



charity, each priest reverently gave the other his blessing and they then went their separate ways. Truly, in every age, the Church survives, because Christ promised that He would be with us all days and the gates of hell will not prevail against her. God's holy Church transcends all borders, all nationalities and cultures, all governments and systems, and with age-old love and devotion she is ever leading us to that eternal and lasting city, the new Jerusalem, in which we will claim not only our true citizenship in heaven but our very identity as adopted children of God Himself. WISDOM OF THE AGES - María Eugenia Suevos is 103 years old, but her voice transmits a strength that transcends age. She's the focus of the first Folksixty video, a project of Variopinto audiovisual productions, whose goal is to share stories that can inspire people to "take action, to be emotionally moved, or to reflect." In the video, which lasts less than three minutes (recorded in Spanish and subtitled in English), Suevos helps us to reflect on love. She speaks about true love, healthy love that isn't selfish and inspires us to try and help each other be better, love that involves sacrifice and leads us to accept others just as they are. Loving, according to Suevos, involves holding on to "the person you are marrying, a beautiful person ... but just a man, with horrible imperfections, just as yours. No one is perfect." This is why she advises us to "first admit your [spouse's] flaws and do your best to help [him or her] deal with them." Love means wanting to be with each other despite our limitations. But Suevos says that nowadays "people aren't very smart" because "people are selfish. They look to their own interests, and that's it." She talks about the fact that many relationships lack true love because "there is no heart, no sacrifice." She believes that people have an erroneous concept of what love is, and that's what leads to dissatisfaction. "What people define as love isn't love, it's just wanting to take that lady to your bed. That isn't love, it's sex. And sex doesn't last ..." She also talks about the need for parents to love their children-sometimes with the "tough love" of teaching them right and wrong even when it's hard-and about the need for every person to help others and accept help, both directly and through personal example. Pope Francis has spoken often of the importance of listening to the wisdom older people, whose wisdom gained through experience is a treasure for new generations. The video (https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=fz_PaLBfSac) provides an opportunity to listen to the advice of a woman who has lived through more than a century of turbulent history and has the remarkable clarity of mind and energy to share it.
