THOUGHTS ON MIDNIGHT MASS - Keeping vigil has always been a spiritual practice in Catholicism. A well-known biblical reference that underscores this point at Christmas is that the shepherds in St. Luke's infancy narratives were keeping watch over their sheep on their nightly vigil the first Christmas. In a sense, we are those same shepherds today, and we are entrusted to keep watch over one another. While we wait for God during Advent, it's also important to note that God also keeps Vigil for us, waiting for us to come home, waiting for us to cooperate with His grace that we surrender more fully to His love. Yes, midnight Mass is inconvenient. In a recent article, Father Raymond Desousa mused on this reality when he wrote, "Midnight Mass is the ultimate sign that we are adjusting our lives to fit Christmas. In the whole year - sacred or profane - no other event begins at midnight. For no other reason do we head out in the middle of the night. In the heart of the night, in the heart of the darkest season, in the heart of the winter bleakness, Catholics gather because they have seen a great light. It is the Christmas tradition par excellence. Why toss it away for greater convenience? Christmas Day begins at midnight, and Mass at that hour indicates that Catholic people are so eager for Christmas that they want to wait not one minute longer than necessary. Catholics frequently complain about the secularization of Christmas. There is little we can do about that, but to the extent that we have an alternative to offer, it means becoming more Catholic not less. Midnight Mass is a uniquely Catholic tradition. What time is midnight Mass? The answer should be obvious." There's something inspiring, consoling and just plain beautiful about worshiping God in the middle of the night—literally mid-night. We are pilgrims on a journey, after all, and so much of that journey is spent in the dark frightened, alone, uncertain. But on Christmas night, shake all that off. We stand and kneel and pray together in defiance of the dark, amid the greatest light imaginable, Emmanuel, singing glory to the newborn king. I think that's worth waking up for.
