**PILGRIMAGE ON PAPER** - Each week the bulletin will feature a different historic church worthy of a visit. Since Fr. Aron's custom of bus trips to interesting churches in our region is impossible for now, it is hoped that you will enjoy the "pilgrimage" in this weekend's bulletin - if only on paper. This week's featured church is Decker's Chapel and St. Mary's Church - St. Marys, PA.

DIOCESE OF ERIE - DECKER'S CHAPEL AND ST. MARY'S CHURCH - ST. MARYS, PA - Once noted for being the county with the highest percentage of Catholics in the United States, Elk County, and most notably the town of St. Marys is a living witness to a quest for freedom by Bavarian Catholics who established a farming commune in the sparsely populated northwestern Pennsylvania county in 1842. In that year, a band of German Catholic immigrants composed of 15 families from Baltimore, and four families from Philadelphia settled on a 30,000 acre tract of wilderness that had been purchased from the Fox Land Company by the German Catholic Brotherhood of Philadelphia and Baltimore for \$0.75 an acre. St. Marys historians Charles Schaut and A.C. Brehm speculate that these early settlers came to northwestern Pennsylvania in an effort to escape the religious persecution that was emerging in the eastern cities; that they were seeking a communal experience where they were free to practice their German heritage and their Roman Catholic religion without harassment. After the official founding on December 8, 1842, what followed was a European migration, primarily Bavarian, but also including immigrants from Prussia, Baden, Hesse, Nassau, France, Wurttemberg, and Bohemia. By 1860, Saint Marys had a population of nearly 2,000 people. In Dec. 1853, the first Mass was held in the current St. Mary's Church. While the first priests at the parish were German Redemptorists, the Benedictine Monks of St. Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe have staffed the parish for most of its existence. Joseph Gravanni painted a scene of Saint Benedict's death on the ceiling of the church in 1900, and the second set of stained-glass windows were installed in 1910. The main altar was designed and built by Benedictine Brother Cosmas Wolf in 1969. William Lambrecht's large painting in the center of it depicts the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception. Just a few miles away from the Church stands a votive chapel known as Decker's Chapel, one of the smallest churches in the United States. A family named Decker arrived in America from Parsberg, Bavaria, Germany in 1846 and settled in an area near what is now St. Marys. One day, while working in his orchard, the elder Michael Decker fell from a tree and injured his back. Deeply religious, he vowed that if the injury healed he would build and maintain a chapel. The injury did heal and the little wayside place of worship became a landmark of Elk County. Decker's Chapel is one of the smallest churches in the world. The original building was built in about 1856. A crude structure, it was renovated over the course of its existence into the picturesque chapel it is today. In 1928, a monument was erected in memory of Monsignor Michael Joseph Decker, the son of the chapel's original builder. Decker's Chapel underwent a major renovation, which was completed in 2016. The original stacked stone foundation was repaired and the floor reinforced to accommodate visitors in wheelchairs. The St. Marys landmark is open every day, year-round. Visitors are encouraged to visit this guiet place of prayer and reflection.
