Random Bits of Catholic News:

FOR GOD'S SAKE, GO BACK TO MASS - In an Easter message published in the newspaper of the Archdiocese of New York, Cardinal Timothy Dolan strongly encouraged parishioners who might still be hesitant to go to church during a pandemic to put fears aside and begin to attend in-person services again. His appeal came shortly after the bishops of Nebraska announced plans to restore the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days starting on May 23^{rd} . In his *Catholic New York*

column, Cardinal Dolan acknowledged that out of an abundance of caution, churches were closed for public worship at the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic and that even when they began to reopen, people were excused from attendance if they still had concerns about contagion. But now, he said, it's becoming more and more apparent that many of those same people have little hesitation to frequent secular venues, even as they continue to skip Sunday Mass. "For the majority of us — are we going to restaurants? To the kids' soccer and little league games? To the store? To the beauty parlor? To gatherings with family and friends?" Dolan asked. "Well, then, it's time to get back to Mass." He said that a pastor in the archdiocese told him that while shopping in local supermarkets, he kept meeting parishioners who "told him how they missed Sunday Mass and wanted to get back." The pastor said to them, "Here you are in a crowded store shopping, taking your time, in contact with items touched by hundreds of people. Church is a lot safer! Come back to get food for your soul!" "We need medicine," he concluded. "We need food for the soul! We need vaccination from sin, Satan and eternal death! We need herd immunity as sheep under Christ our Good Shepherd. All this we behold at Mass! How can we stay away? Easter blessings! See you at Mass!"

FRENCH PRESIDENT VISITS NOTRE DAME DAYS AFTER QUASIMODO SUNDAY -

Two years after a fire tore through Paris' most famous cathedral and shocked the world, French President Emmanuel Macron visited the building site this past Thursday to show that French heritage has not been forgotten despite the coronavirus. Macron promised the cathedral would be rebuilt by 2024, though officials said earlier this month that the burned-out cathedral could remain under construction for another 15 or 20 years. That being said officials have pledged that Notre Dame will be at least be open for prayer and a "return to worship" in time for the 2024 Summer Olympics, which Paris is hosting. "I can say today that the cathedral is saved. It is well secured, and we can now do the huge work of reconstruction that is not going to destabilize the whole building," Notre Dame's rector, Monsignor Patrick Chauvet, told reporters. As an aside, Quasimodo Sunday is one of the old names for the Second Sunday of Easter – it was the day on which Victor Hugo's character in the Hunchback of Notre Dame was found as an abandoned infant inside Notre Dame Cathedral in 1462.

PRAYERS FOR HAITI - This week the Haitian bishops' conference asked that church bells ring at noon across Haiti and that Masses be offered for change for the better in the country following the recent kidnapping of five Catholic priests, two nuns and three laypeople. The victims were abducted on their way to a parish near the capital of Port-au-Prince early April 11. Father Ludger Mazile, secretary of the Haitian bishops' conference, told *Agence France Presse* April 12 that the kidnappers had demanded a ransom of \$1 million for the group's release.

SHOTS FIRED AT CONVENT - A convent of Benedictine nuns in rural Missouri are trying to raise \$200,000 for a security fence around their property, as a number of shootings have posed a risk to their lives. This lent, there have been three shootings that have hit the abbey of the Benedictines of Mary, Queen of Apostles — a serious uptick in firearm activity that stretches back for years. Mother Cecilia, the abbess, said that the area is normally not a high crime area, so the unusual nature of the shootings is a source of concern that the nuns may be targeted. "It is clearly targeted at us," said Mother Cecelia. "Whether it is someone doing this 'for fun' or out of pure malice, we don't know." The incidents are "extremely disturbing," she added, since it seems the sisters are being targeted by at least one person, or even multiple people. In their statement, the sisters said the shootings "are exceedingly good reminders to heed St. Benedict's words to 'keep death daily before one's eyes."
