

## Basket Blessings—Egg Hunt Following

The tradition of blessing easter baskets will be observed at Noon on Holy Saturday at the St. John's in Central City (164 Wheeler Street) and 4:00 PM at All Saints in Boswell. If you haven't participated in this tradition before, please consider this yearly custom of gratitude and joy (even if you aren't of Eastern European heritage). Catholicism worships soul and body, a feast of the senses, an elevation of the natural to the supernatural. The smell of paska, garlic kolbasi, and incense on Holy Saturday - ah the sweet smell of resurrection! Blessing of easter foods helps to link the altar of the church to the altar of our home, a special blessed meal to be enjoyed on the holiest day of the year. In addition to the customary foods such as ham, kolbasi, bacon, salt, eggs, and horseradish there are many customs practiced that are limited to regions or specific ethnic groups. If you chose to use them as a guide that's great, but feel free to modify according to taste, ethnicity, or current situation – just make sure you come and get your Easter foods blessed. An Easter Egg Hunt at each parish will follow blessing of baskets on the church grounds. All Saints is for children 4th grade and younger. OLQA is for children 6th grade and younger All are welcomed, please bring your own basket or bag.

## Holy Thursday—Seven Churches

Every year the faithful take part in a beautiful, international tradition of visiting seven churches following Holy Thursday Mass. This year you are invited to consider making this part of your devotional life by visit seven local Churches in our area. The tradition of visiting Seven Churches on Holy Thursday grew out of this time of prayer and adoration that follows the Mass of the Lord's Supper. Jesus asked his disciples to stay and watch with Him while they were in the garden, and that's why we have Adoration after Mass until the traditional time of midnight every year on Holy Thursday. This tradition of mindful watching is a sort of pilgrimage to various altars of repose, in different churches that correspond to each of the seven places, or "stations," that were made by Jesus between the Last Supper in the Upper Room to His crucifixion on the cross. The seven stations consist of: Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus bound and taken before Annas, Jesus taken before the High Priest, Caiaphas, Jesus taken before Pilate, Jesus taken before Herod, Jesus taken before Pilate again and Jesus given the crown of thorns and led to his crucifixion. Upon entering each church, pilgrims visit the altar of repose, kneel, make the sign of the cross, read the appropriate scripture for each station and engage in private prayer and adoration. The origin of the Seven Churches Visitation is typically credited to St. Philip Neri and is practiced by Catholics around the world, including in Poland, Mexico, Italy and the Philippines and is very popular in Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, and Buffalo. The devotion can also be traced back to the Station Churches of Rome, where the tradition is still practiced. The Seven Churches Visitation is a powerful way to spend time in adoration, meditating on Christ's sacrifice of love for the salvation of souls in preparation for the joy of Easter. There is something special about visiting churches late into the night. It is not just because of the opportunity to visit other parishes, it's because of intentionally seeking Christ to spend time with Him and contemplating the gift of His love. If you wish to make this pilgrimage part of your devotional life, below is the list of Somerset County churches. Plan your route according to time and proximity.
