**PARISH COUNCIL THIS WEEK** - There will be a parish council meeting on Monday of this week (May 22<sup>nd</sup>) at the St. John site at 6:30 PM. All members are asked to be present.

HOIST THE JOLLY ROGER - On Sunday July 16<sup>th</sup> the parish will be hosting a bus trip to watch the Pittsburgh Pirates play the St. Louis Cardinals. There are 55 seats available (section 103, rows L,M,P,Q,R,S - an end seat in every row). Tickets are \$41.00 and include \$10 in free concessions and bus transportation from Central City. Since the game is on a Sunday we will attend Mass in Pittsburgh at Immaculate Heart of Mary Church (the "Polish Cathedral of Pittsburgh") and will head to the game. N.B. The father of the priest at Immaculate Heart of Mary played for the Pirates (Frank Thomas). The trip will depart from St. John's parking lot at 8:30 AM on Sunday July 16<sup>th</sup>. The deadline for the trip is June 1<sup>st</sup>. To reserve your spot please CALL THE RECTORY.

**SENIOR EXPO** - There will be a "Senior Expo" on Thursday May 25<sup>th</sup> at St. Paul Presbyterian Church in Somerset from 10:00 AM until Noon. The expo will include different non-profits as well as government agencies that provide different services to area senior citizens. There is no admission fee to attend the expo.

**ALL-YOU-CAN-EAT BREAKFAST** - The parish will sponsor an ALL-YOU-CAN-EAT breakfast buffet on Sunday June 4th at the St. John site from 9:00 AM until Noon. The breakfast includes scrambled eggs, bacon, sausage, hash browns, pancakes, French toast, donuts, toast, juice, and coffee. The cost is \$8.00 for adults, \$4.00 for children ages 8 to 4, children under 4 are free. All are welcome - the proceeds go a long way to help fund quality events for our parish students.

**CHICKEN BARBEQUE** - The Knights of Columbus are sponsoring a Take-Out-Only barbeque chicken dinner on Saturday June 24<sup>th</sup> from 11:00 AM until 1:00 PM in the activity center. Tickets are \$9.00 each and are available after all weekend Masses or by phoning Ken Skone at 754-5584.

**ROSARY THIS MONTH** - May is traditionally set aside as a particular time to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary. The Holy Rosary will be prayed before the 4:00 PM Vigil Mass each Saturday in May beginning at 3:30 PM. Please bring your rosary with you spend a little extra time asking our Blessed Mother for her prayers.

BUS TRIP - On Sunday August 6th Fr. Aron will be offering a bus tour of historic Catholic churches in Philadelphia. Because the trip is also people from the Altoona area, the bus will meet pick-up those attending in Bedford (those interested can car pool from Central City). Traveling by Raystown motor coach, the first stop will be the Cathedral Basilica of Saints Peter and Paul, the "Mother-Church" of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. Following a tour of the cathedral those present will attend the cathedral's 11:00 AM Mass. Built in Roman-Corinthian style, the building heavily influenced Philadelphia native, Bishop John McCort, when he constructed his cathedral in Altoona. After Mass, lunch will be at the Reading Terminal Market. Filled with old-world festive energy, the Reading Terminal Market is host to many ethnic and specialty food vendors. Among the vendors is Tommy DiNic's - a Reading Terminal institution - proudly serving a legendary roast pork sandwich that was voted the best sandwich in the country! Following lunch the next stop will be St. Adalbert's Church in Philadelphia's Port Richmond neighborhood. St. Adalbert's is the last remaining officially designated Polish parish in the Archdiocese of Philadelphia. An authentic Polish neighborhood, Port Richmond is home to a number of Polish merchants (there should be some time to visit one near the church), and is home to not only many older Polish-American families, but also many new arrivals from Poland. Following our visit to St. Adalbert's the bus will

travel to the church of St. Peter the Apostle. St. Peter's serves as the final resting place for the body of St. John Neumann, the 4th bishop of Philadelphia (his body, covered in wax, is visible under the altar). The final church on the tour is Old St. Joseph Church, the oldest parish in Philadelphia. In obtrusive and simple, Old St. Joseph's was at one time the only place in the English-speaking world where Mass was legally celebrated. The tour will end with dinner at in the Italian Market section of the city at Ralph's Restaurant, the oldest Italian restaurant in the United States (family owned into the 5th generation). Dinner, served family style, includes salad, soup, veal parmigiana, chicken trombino (breasts of chicken diced and sautéed with roasted peppers, plum tomatoes, topped with sharp provolone in a garlic, oil and white wine sauce), linguini pescatore (white shrimp, clams, mussels and crabmeat over linguini), and is followed by coffee/tea, and cannoli. The cost of the trip is \$90.00 per person and INCLUDES dinner at Ralph's, bus transportation, and hours and hours and hours of Fr. Aron talking about faith, history, and, probably, himself.
