MEETING OF EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION – If you are an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (formerly known as Eucharistic Ministers) who helps to distribute Holy Communion at Mass and/or takes Communion to the homebound please plan to stay after the Mass you attend NEXT weekend (January 9th &10th) for a brief review of some minor changes in this ministry.

PRIEST ON THE TITANIC – When the Titanic began to sink on April 15, 1912, Father Thomas Byles had two opportunities to board a lifeboat. But he forewent those opportunities, according to passengers aboard the sinking ocean liner, in order to hear confessions and offer consolation and prayers with those who were trapped aboard. Recently the initial process toward canonization was initiated in his native England – his story is worthy of note. Some 1,500 people died when the Titanic hit an iceberg and sank in the Atlantic Ocean in 1912. Believed at the time to be "unsinkable," the ship lacked adequate lifeboats for all the passengers on its maiden voyage from Southampton to New York City. Fr. Byles was traveling on the Titanic to preside at his

brother's wedding in New York. The 42-year-old British priest had been ordained in Rome 10 years prior and had served as a parish priest at Saint Helen's Church in Essex since 1905. Miss Agnes McCoy, a third class passenger and survivor of the Titanic, said Fr. Byles had been on the ship, hearing confessions, praying with passengers and giving his blessing as the vessel sank. Helen Mary Mocklare, another third class passenger, offered more details about the final hours of the priest's life. She recounted that a sailor "warned the priest of his danger and begged him to board a boat." Although the sailor was anxious to help him, the priest twice refused to leave. "Fr. Byles could have been saved, but he would not leave while one (passenger) was left and the sailor's entreaties were not heeded," Mocklare recounted. "After I got in the boat, which was the last one to leave, and we were slowly going further away from the ship, I could hear distinctly the voice of the priest and the responses to his prayers." In addition to Fr. Byles two other priests (Fr. Juozas Montvilla and Fr. Josef Peruschitz, O.S.B.) were on board the Titanic and died when it sank – all three priests ministered to those in need until death. May Fr. Byles pray for us that we become people of greater duty and integrity.

HOUSE BLESSING – In keeping with the age-old custom of Polish and Slovak people Fr. Aron is happy to come and bless your home beginning next week. Please phone the rectory to set up a time. Traditionally done during the weeks surrounding Epiphany the blessing of homes is a great way to call to mind God's presence as we begin our new year. (N.B. Please do not avoid having your house blessed because you are worried about Father judging your home – this is about asking for Divine Assistance, not about being featured in *Better Homes and Gardens*).

VISIT FROM FR. ARON – If you have any concerns that you would like to discuss with Fr. Aron he is more than happy to meet and talk. Moreover if you or a loved one is unable to come to Mass due to a serious illness please contact Fr. Aron and he will be happy to bring you or your loved one Holy Communion.
