BIZZARE PROTESTS IN LAS VEGAS – Las Vegas Catholics are disturbed after protestors disrupted Masses at several churches in the metropolitan area within the past few weeks. In at least three incidents, the group "Koosha Las Vegas," have walked in to churches in the middle of Mass shouting at Catholics to repent and later posting videos of the protests to their YouTube page. According to their videos, the group consists of street preachers and self-proclaimed "soldiers" for Jesus. One video shows at least four men wearing "Trust Jesus" t-shirts walking up the aisle during a Mass, handing out pamphlets and telling the congregation that as Catholics they have "sinned against (God) and broken all of his laws." The man behind the camera then shouts "Guys repent! And turn to Jesus Christ! Pope is a Satan! Mary statue is a Satan!" Last week, the group protested outside of Bishop Gorman Catholic School in Las Vegas. In that video, a man can be heard telling passerby students, "If you look at the catechism of the Catholic Church and you look at scripture, you know why God hates this religious system." The Diocese of Las Vegas is working with police to educate their clergy about the incidents.
