Lenten Regulations

Abstinence - The law of abstinence requires a Catholic 14 years of age **until death** to abstain from eating meat on Fridays in honor of the Passion of Jesus. Meat is considered to be the flesh and organs of mammals and fowl. Theologians have traditionally considered this also to forbid soups or gravies made

from them. Salt and freshwater species of fish, amphibians, reptiles and shellfish are permitted, as are animal-derived products such as gelatin, butter, cheese and eggs, which do not have any meat taste. During Lent abstinence from meat on Fridays is obligatory in the United States as elsewhere, and it is sinful not to observe this discipline without a serious reason (physical labor, pregnancy, those with unsound mind, sickness etc.). Fasting – The law of fasting requires a Catholic from the 18th Birthday to the 59th Birthday to reduce the amount of food eaten from normal. The Church defines this as one meal a day, and two smaller meals which if added together would not exceed the main meal in quantity. Such fasting is obligatory on Ash Wednesday & Good Friday. The fast is broken by eating between meals and by drinks which could be considered food (milk shakes, but not milk). Alcohol does not break the fast; however, they seem contrary to the spirit of doing penance.
