PARISH BUS TRIP - A GREAT EVENING GET AWAY - Our parish will be sponsoring an evening at the theater with dinner and Mass on Saturday July 14th. Traveling via Bollman motor coach we will travel to St. Vincent College for their Summer Theater's performance of *Numsense*, a musical comedy that is the second-longest-running Off-Broadway show in history. Now in their 50th season, St. Vincent Summer Theater is composed of an all-star cast of some of New York and Pittsburgh's greatest professional stage performers. Departing at 3:15 PM from St. John's parking lot, the motor coach will first stop at the newly restored Holy Family Church in Latrobe for their 4:30 PM Mass (fulfills obligation). The historic church was lovingly restored last year to its former glory after a dramatic renovation in the 1960s removed much of its art. Following Mass will be treated to dinner at Rizzo's Malabar Inn in the tiny town of Crabtree. Rizzo's is regarded by many as one of the finest authentic Italian restaurants in Western Pennsylvania. Dinner includes salad, pizza, chicken parmesan, sausage and meatballs, meat ravioli, homemade spaghetti, tiramisu, coffee and tea. Following dinner and a brief tour of St. Vincent Basilica, the group will attend St. Vincent Summer Theater's performance of *Nunsense*. The play has been described as a little vacation from the chaos of life - an invitation to a few hours of silly, sentimental and sublime entertainment. Following the show there will be a chance to relax a bit at the theater's Cabaret. Unique to Saint Vincent Summer Theatre, the Cabaret provides an opportunity for patrons to enjoy a summer evening after taking in a performance. Held directly after the show, Cabaret serves food and drinks to theatergoers and allows them to sit at tables inside and outside of the theater area, all while enjoying live music. The bus will arrive back in Central City about 11:00 PM. The cost is \$69.00 per person and includes transportation, the show, and dinner. MARIAN APPARITIONS YOU PROBABLY NEVER HEARD OF - During the month of May, a month dedicated to Marian devotion, you may recall some of the better known Marian apparitions (Lourdes, Fatima, Guadalupe). However here are four that are approved by the Church that you probably don't know about but are worthy of devotion.

Laus, France

During May of 1664, a young shepherdess named Benoite Rencurel suddenly saw a magnificent lady holding a child. These apparitions lasted for about a year, while she experienced various other visions throughout her life. Mary's primary message was that of penance and conversion, reconciling oneself with God and each other. The apparitions were recognized in 1665 by the local bishop, and officially approved by the Vatican in 2008.

Rue du Bac, Paris, France

On July 18th, 1830, a young religious woman named Catherine Laboure experienced a beautiful vision of Our Lady. She received several other visions, which led to the popular devotion of the Miraculous Medal, promising many graces to those who wore the medal devoutly. The apparitions were officially approved in 1836 and have been one of the most popular apparitions ever since.

Siluva, Lithuania

In 1608, a group of shepherd children saw a vision of a weeping woman holding a child. Our Lady was sorrowful that the people of the village had lost the Catholic faith. Most returned to the practice of the faith. The apparitions were officially approved on August 17, 1775, by the Vatican.

Lezajsk, Poland

In 1578 a woodcutter named Thomas Michalek saw a vision of Our Lady in the forest. She asked for a chapel to be built, saying, "I chose this place. Here my Son will be loved and respected and whosoever shall call upon my intercession, will receive my blessing." The pope personally approved the apparition in 1752.

SANCTUARY CANDLE INTENTIONS - The Sanctuary Candle, at the Sacred Heart site, burns in loving memory of George Napora, as a Birthday Remembrance and an Anniversary Remembrance for George and Ann Louise. The Sanctuary Candle burns at the St. John's site in loving memory of Bob Fetsko by Family.

FOUR FAKE APPARITIONS - Many people have claimed to have received an apparition of the Blessed Mother, only a few have been approved by the Church. Here are four (there are plenty more) that have been investigated and declared phony.

Lipa, Philippines

It was claimed that the Blessed Virgin Mary appeared several times to a nun called Sr. Teresita in the Carmelite convent where she lived in 1948. Initially these visions were viewed favorably by the local bishop, but after a further investigation the Church officially declared on March 28, 1951, that the apparitions were not of supernatural origin. The Vatican reaffirmed that decision on December 11, 2015.

Agoo, La Union, Philippines

An individual named Judiel Nieva allegedly received various heavenly apparitions and supernatural powers between 1989 and 1993. After careful examination by the local bishop, examining the visions and the

messages received, it was declared in 1993 that the apparitions were not supernatural in origin. This was confirmed by a second commission in 1996.

Rochester, New York

A man named John Leary claims that he regularly receives messages from Jesus and Mary since a 1993 trip to Medjugorje. He has published these messages in various print and online media. On July 7, 2000, the local bishop declared that "the 'locutions' are human in origin, not divine."

Denver, Colorado

In 1990 a woman named Theresa Lopez said she received visions of the Blessed Virgin Mary at the Mother Cabrini Shrine in Denver. Many others accompanied her and stared at the sun for a promised apparition. The local bishop investigated the claims and declared on March 9, 1994, that the visions were "devoid of any supernatural origin" and urged the faithful to refrain from participating in anything associated with the visions.
